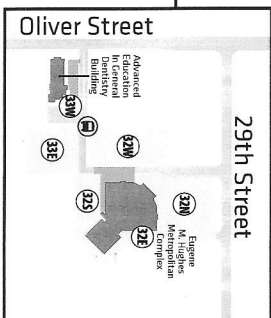
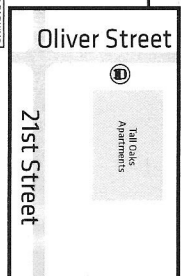
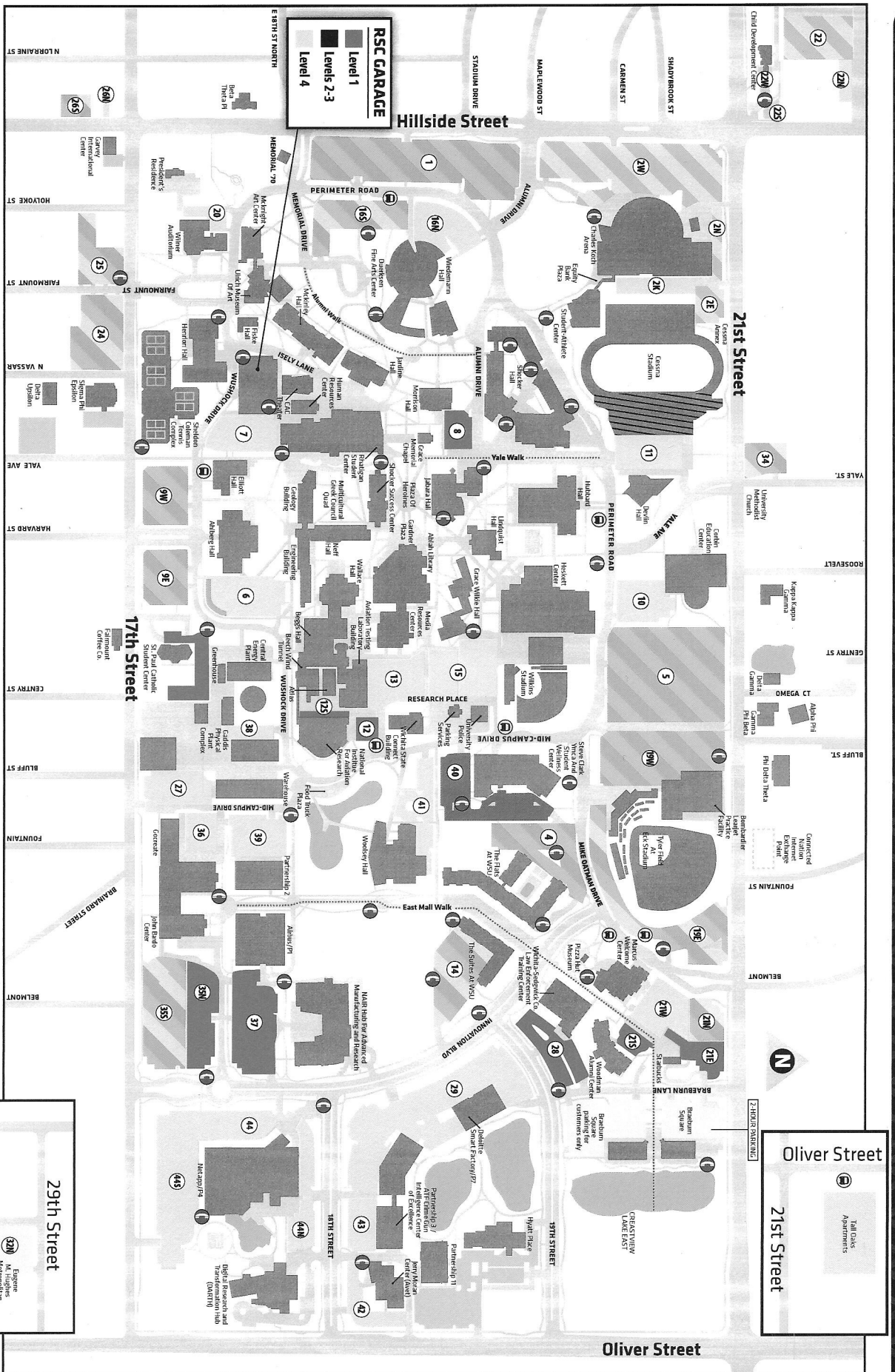

SHUTTLE STOPS

METROPLEX ROUTE (ROUTE 202A)
7 a.m. - 10 p.m. Monday - Friday
Every 30 minutes

This route connects the Eugene M. Hughes Metroplex to the main campus and is free to all. No Shocker ID required. It follows the circulator route around the main campus, then takes White Dam Road to 21st Street before continuing to the Metroplex. There are also Wichita Transit stops available for apartment complexes along north Oliver.

EMERGENCY CALL BOX LOCATIONS

During the fall and spring semesters, Wichita State's main campus is a permit-only parking environment on weekdays when the University is open for business. Visitors may park during enforcement times in selected lots for three times without a permit each semester. Please note: visitor status only applies to non-WSU affiliated persons. WSU students, faculty and staff wishing to park on campus during the enforcement period must register online with the Shocker Parking Management System to park legally. The system features license plate recognition (LPR) technology and virtual permits called ePermits that eliminate the need for color-coded hangtags and stickers for parking enforcement. ePermits are required from 7 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday (with the exception of the RSC parking garage which requires ePermits 24/7). Please review the parking maps below to locate appropriate parking areas for students, faculty and staff. Lots and spaces with red signage are reserved at all times.
